

At a Court held for the County of Southampton on the 17th day of January 1876.
This last Will and Testament of Gustavus D. Barham, was proved by the Oath of David H.
Hundred of Pelage Green, the Subscribing witnesses thereto, and believed by the recorder
and in the opinion of Masters of Barham, the executor therein named, who made oath
in Chancery Docket, that without fraud or collusion in the presence of
Court requiring same, which should be believed to be true, and the
Certificate is granted the said Masters of Barham for obtaining a probate of the said
Will in due form.

In the Name of God, amen, I, William Dick, of the County of Southampton, in State of
Virginia, do hereby make and publish this my Will and Testament, in manner and form
following, that is to say:

Item 1st, After my decease, I desire that all my just debts and funeral expenses be paid
out of my Estate, also for a roof to be placed over my grave, and also a
roof to be placed over the grave of my deceased daughter Martha Dick,
and also a roof to be placed over my dear Daughter Caroline Dick's grave,
out of my Estate.

Item 2nd, I give and bequeath to my Daughter, Mary Ann Dick, one Teacher's Bed
and Head, and the fourth part in value of all my Bed Clothes or Covers and
in Carpet.

Item 3rd, I give and bequeath to my Daughter, Martha J. Dipe, one Teacher's Bed and
Head and the fourth part in value of all my Bed Clothes or Covers and
my best Walnut Table and Oak Chair.

Item 4th, I give and bequeath to my Daughter Sally C. Ferguson, my Sideboard
and Table, two Spitechens, two Decanters, six Glasses and Water?

Item 5th, I give and bequeath to the children of my deceased Daughter Ann
C. Ferguson, wife of Henry C. Ferguson, the dollar, only, to them to
be equally divided amongst them, and no more.

Item 6th, I Give to my Daughter Caroline E. Jones during her life, one
Teacher's Bed and Bed Head and the fourth part in value of all my
Bed Clothes or Covers, one Imping Table and Chair and Looking Glass,
my best Chair and one Iron Bed, and at her death her share
of my property I give to her child or children if she leaves any, but if they
die before they are of age or marry, then that portion I give to be
equally divided between Mary Ann Dick, Martha J. Dipe and Sally C.
Ferguson, or their heirs, or if they leave no heirs, then I leave the
same to my child, I give her portion to be equally divided between
my three Daughters just named in this item.

Item 7th, I give and bequeath the balance of my Estate to be equally divided between
my four Daughters, Mary Ann Dick, Martha J. Dipe and Sally C.
Ferguson and Caroline E. Jones, the four portions to descend as it does
in the 6th item.

Item 8th, And lastly I hereby revoke and appoint my friend Parker
O. Strong Executor of this my last Will and Testament, revoking and
annulling all other Wills or Testaments by me heretofore made, In
witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal
at Newport News, I leave hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal
