Pope, during her life, my place of the Land therein attached embracing the Poplar field land in the Poplar field, with all the woodland around the Poplar field land in that is a line between the Poplar field, of the Poplar field, together with all other Lands adjoining the Original home tract, not otherwise herein before.

Item 4th, I give to my son Russell B. Pope of his heirs forever, my place known as the "Old Quarter" which I bought of Don J. Myrick of Staunton. This farm of the one in which said R. B. Pope now lives, for which I have
