In the Name of God, Amen, I Joseph G. Crumpler of the County of Loudoun in the State of Virginia, being sound of Body and of sane mind and being deeply impressed with the uncertainty of life, especially in my present profession, do make this my last will and testament.

I give to my beloved wife Elizabeth Virginia Crumpler, One third part of my entire Estate, both personal & real, during her natural life. I leave the remainder of my Estate I give to my child Anne Laura, and should in the providence of God other children be born to me, then my Estate shall be equally divided between them.

I leave, in the event of the death of my child or children, before obtaining their majority, should they leave no child, if any, then my whole Estate shall go to my wife I hereby constitute and appoint my wife Elizabeth V. Crumpler, Executrix of this my will, and charge her to settle all my just debts. Done this twenty fourth day of March 1845.

At a Court held for the County of Loudoun, on the 15th day of February A.D. 1848. This last will & Testament of Joseph G. Crumpler dec'd. Was partially proved by the affirmation of B. B. Puckett, One of its Subscribing Witnesses. And at a Court held for the said County, on the 19th day of February A.D. 1848. This last will and Testament of Joseph G. Crumpler dec'd. Was fully proved by the Oath of Wm. H. Spain Jr. the other Subscribing Witness thereto, and Ordered to be recorded. And Elizabeth V. Crumpler, the Executrix therein named, refusing to take upon herself the burden of the execution thereof, as the custom of Justice, J. Hays who made Oath according to law, and together with C. C. Vaughan, his Secretary, (who justified in Oath as to his Sufficiency) entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of fifteen hundred dollars, conditioned as the law directs, Which bond is Ordered to be recorded. Certificate is granted to said Josiah Hays for obtaining letters of administration on the Estate of the said Joseph G. Crumpler dec'd. And his will annexed in due form.
