In the Name of God amen, I, George Thomas Camp of the County of Southampton State of Virginia, being of sound and disposing mind & memory and considering the uncertainty of this mortal life, do make and devise this my last will and Testament, in manner and form following, Item 1st After the payment of all my just debts, I give bequest and devise to my wife Mary Ann Missouri Camp, the following to wit, One against W. H. Drury & Co. for Two hundred and thirty dollars payable on demand, dated 1st day of July 1873, another against W. H. Drury & Co. for Three hundred and fifty dollars payable on demand and dated 1st day of July 1873, and One against John S. Burns and Joseph J. Drury, for Three hundred dollars, payable on demand and dated 1st day of January 1878, also the sum of One hundred and fifty dollars, the interest I had collected at the expiration of bonds, also the following property which I have at the time of my marriage, viz: Three feather beds and furniture, One Bureau, One large rocking chair, all silver ware, One Wardrobe and Chest Item 2nd I give bequest and devise to my son Stafford Thomas Camp the residue of my property both real and personal wherever found, or wherever it may be, I intend he die before marrying or arriving to the age of twenty One year, should die without all my real Estate, to be sold and that the half of the said property devised to my son should be given to my wife and the other half to be equally divided among the living children of my Sister Martha Jane Larkins, the living children of my Sister Mary Wiggertaff, and Alice and Walter children of my Sister Fannie Sprister Item 3rd I hereby constitute and appoint my trustworthy friend James C. Selwell, Guardian of the person & property of my son Stafford Thomas Camp, during his minority, and devise that he should
