

And the name of God, amen, I, James E. Peters of the County of
 Southampton, and State of Virginia, being of sound and disposing mind,
 do hereby declare this to be my last will and Testament, in form and
 manner as following,

Item 1st I give to my Daughter Mary, of Mr. Camp Fifty Dollars in
 money, and a pair of gold Spectacles she now has in possession -
 Item 2nd I give to my Daughter Hannah, of Prince, during her life, and
 at her death to her Children, the following Lands, viz. the plantation she
 lives on, the two places I bought of Wm. B. Shanks, (Truster) Called Turner's Contain-
 ing two hundred acres, each, more or less, & One hundred and twenty five
 acres, more or less, situated West of the line run by Capt. Mills, Comm-
 encing at a pine on the public road, near Catts branch, due North to
 Morris Estate. I also give to her all the property I own which she now
 lives on, the books & pictures she had at school, also the Season -
 I give to her Children Ninety Nine hundred Dollars, to be appraised to
 them as they arrive at the age of twenty One year, the interest accruing
 from said money to be expended on their Education, if any One of them
 should die before arriving to the age of twenty One, that One part of said
 and money to be divided between the living. I intend if my said Daughter
 Hannah, of Prince should die without leaving Children, or all of her Children
 should die before becoming of age, or marrying then their property shall
 revert to my family.

Item 3rd I give to my Grand daughter Peggy, of Prince the land I own lying
 in the Counties of Greensville & Brunswick Containing Three hundred acres,
 more or less, formerly land of Thomas J. Marshall & sold to me by Walter B.
 Chambliss (Truster) also Five hundred Dollars in money, first chosen Bed
 & furniture for the same, her Bureau & books.

Item 4th I give to my Grand son James E. Prince, the place called Jagers
 Opposite the residence of Mr. Camp, Containing Three hundred and sixty
 acres of Land divided from my land track by a line run by Capt.
 Mills, Commencing at a large Sweet Gum on public road and running
 due North to Land of W. B. Shanks, I also give him One bed and
 furniture for the same. I intend in the event of the death of either
 my grand children Peggy, of Prince or James Prince, before arriving
 at the age of Twenty One, or marrying, then the surviving One to have
 the other part, and if both shall die before arriving at the age of
 twenty One or marrying then the property I leave them to revert to my family,
 except the money (Five hundred dollars,) which I leave my Grand daughter
 Peggy, of Prince, which she can use at her discretion.

Item 5th I give to my son John M. Peters all of my Land West of
 the line running from Sweet Gum tree to Clements Land, (mentioned in Item 4th)
 including houses & Containing Three hundred & twenty five acres, more
 land Called Waller's Containing One hundred & twenty five acres, more
 or less, I also give to my son John M. Peters, all the money I have
 money, Certificates, bonds, Notes, including all of my
 heretofore disposed of in my will provided he supports
 Peters during his life.
