Secondly, I give and devise to my beloved wife, Mary Alice Prickett, all my Lands in the County of Southampton, Virginia, in whatsoever, to her and her heirs and assigns forever.

Thirdly, I appoint my said beloved wife, Mary Alice Prickett, Executrix of this, my last will and Testament, and require that no Security be required of her as such.

And on the Motion of Mary Alice Prickett, the Executrix thereof named, who was duly sworn to her, and entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of Ten Thousand dollars, (but without Security, she will answering that none should be required, and the Court requiring none.) Considered as the law directs. Which bond is ordered to be recorded.

Certificate is granted the said Mary Alice Prickett for the raising a probate of the said will in due form.

I being now by these presents, that I have of Body of Robert & Son Respect County of Southampton & State of Virginia on this the Eleventh day of September in the year of our Lord One thousand Eight hundred and Eighty, being of Sound and disposing Mind but diseased in body do make this my last will and Testament.

First, I will & direct that all my just debts & funeral expenses be paid. Second, I give & bequeath to my beloved friend and cousin James E. Stephenson the Sum of Three hundred dollars, to be paid and his heirs forever. Third, I give & bequeath to my friend Chas. W. Jones & his Children jointly the Sum of Three hundred dollars, to be paid to his heirs forever. Fourth, I give and bequeath to my brother George P. Stephenson & my Sister Catharine Stephenson, each, One hundred dollars, to be paid & their heirs forever.

Fifth, I give and bequeath to the Children now living of my brother Wm. Stephenson, viz. Lulu P. and Claude Stephenson,
