

In the Name of Almighty God, Amen, I, Benjamin H. Travis of the County of Southampton State of Virginia, being of sound Mind, but full Body, do make and Ordain this my Last Will and Testament, and do by this act annul and revoke all other Wills that may have been made by me at any time Subsequent to the date of this.

Item 1st, In Consideration of his pious Service and in Consideration that he is to Care for me, and by the Care of me and my Sister Catherine P. Travis, as long as we live, and worthy, wise and for us as he now does, and see no decedent of Service, after we are dead, I give and Bequeath unto my friend Reuben C. Morris, my tract of Land or other portion of it, and I will that, known as the Richard B. Travis Tract, the said Tract is supposed to contain one hundred acres, to be his in fee simple, and to be his and his Heirs forever.

Item 2^d, The balance of my Real and Personal Estate is to be sold at my death, and as if my just Debt to be paid.

Item 3^d, All that remains of my Estate after my and my Sister C. P. Travis Taxes Expensed and paid, is to be Equally divided between the Children of my Son Barton J. Travis dead. Namely of the said Children and, Virginia P. Travis, Josephine Whitaker Travis and Elizabeth Barton Travis, to be theirs and their Heirs forever.

Item 4th, My Sister C. P. Travis should she outlive me, is to have I suppose as long as she lives, at the place I now live at, and a Support out of my Estate that may be left after paying my just Debt, and I hereby appoint my Friend John A. Rain, of Sussex County, to be my Administrator of this my Last Will and Testament. Given under my hand and Seal in the presence of the Witnesses whom I named and affixed unto this Instrument, & Will, this 13th Day of July, one thousand Eight hundred and Eighty, done at Fairfax County, State of Virginia, this day and date Above mentioned.
