with 220 acres land adjoining the same during her life and after her death I give the  
land and Plantation to my son John Bailey to him and his heirs forever  
I further give to my wife the sum of two Negroes Dick & Peter during her life & after  
her death one will and Desire is that my daughter Mary Willson may have the  
name Peter & Dick may leave me with Barnaby Bailey and the other with my son John Bailey  
I further give unto my living wife all my household and kitchen furniture and  
my stock of cattle hogs sheep &c that shall not be hereafter disposed of by me  
to her or us forever

Also I give unto my son Barnaby Bailey negro man Tom and my Carpenter Tools  
and also what I have already given him before hand
