In the name of God Amen I Nathan Robert Williams  
of Southampton County and Colony of Virginia being sick and  
weak of body but of perfect mind and memory calling to rem-  
embrance the mortality of all mankind and knowing it is ap-  
pointed for all men once to die I do recommend my soul into the  
hands of Almighty God that gave it keeping at the General Res-  
urrection to receive the same again and my body to be buried  
in decent and Christian like form at the discretion of my executors  
as touching my worldly estate wherewith it hath pleased God  
to bless me I do give and dispose of in manner and form  
following that is to say

I do give and bequeath to my son Robert Williams and my  
son Giles Chapman Williams my land and plantation whereon I now  
live to be equally divided between them after my Wifes death  
Likewise I give and bequeath to my well beloved Wife Elizabeth  
My Horse and Mare as her right and property during her  
Widowhood likewise four head of Cattle during her widowhood  
(and all my Hogs Slave for the use of my family) and then to  
be equally divided between my three children that is to say  
my daughter Darcys and my sons Joshua and Sethra and  
my crop that is now a growing Slave for the use and support  
of the family and my movable goods Slave to my Wife Elizabeth  
for the use and support of my family Likewise I do leave and  
appoint my well beloved Wife Elizabeth my whole and sole Ex-  
ecutor to this my last Will and Testament Revoking and  
Releasing all others Whereunto I have set my hand and af-  
fixed my seal this Fourth day of October and in the year of  
our Lord God One thousand seven hundred and seventy two
