December 9. 1773 In Obedience to an order of Court bearing date
 last September we have allotted assigned and set apart the portion
 of the widow of James Powell deceased in land and Negroes as
 followeth (to wit) The land by a line of Marked trees from a
 Red Oak in Sam'l: Atkinsons line to a tree on the side of a
 branch in Shaarick Carttons line then down the Branch to Blunt
 Swamp then up the Swamp to the said Atkinson line then along
 the said line to the beginning of one Negro fellow named Frank
 And have likewise Audited and settled the Acco: Curr: of
 the said Estate as above stated Ben Blunt
 Corral & Yorkleek
 Thos Edmunds

At a Court held for the County of Southampton the 13 Jan: 1774
 This Account of the Administration of the estate of James
 Powell deceased was reported by the persons Appointed to settle the

Bynum William Will
 In the Name of GOD AMEN I William Bynum
 of the County of Southampton of the parish of St. Lukes being sick
 and weak of body but of sound and disposing Memory do make
 this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following

Imprimis I give and bequeath to my son William Bynum the
 land and plantation wherow I now live containing by estimation three
 hundred acres to him and his heirs forever Also I give to my son
 William Bynum a Negro girl called and known by the name of Little
 Lucy to him & his heirs forever

Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Ann my Negro
 boy called Jack and to his heirs forever provided nevertheless
 it is my desire that if my daughter Ann should die without issue
 of her body lawfully begotten that then the said Negro be sold
 return to my estate and be considered as part thereof and be incor-
 rectly divided amongst my children

Item I give and bequeath to my son John and to his heirs for
 ever my Negro girl called Jenny Also after the death of
 beloved wife Martha I give and bequeath to my son John my
 Negro called Jenny to him and his heirs forever
