 the said line to the beginning of one Negro fellow named Frank
 And have likewise Auditted and settled the Acco^t Curr^t
 of the said Estate as above stated Ben Blunt

 of the County of Southampton of the parish of St Lukes being sick
 and Weak of body but of sound and disposing Memory do make
 this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following
 I premiss I give and bequeath to my Son William Baynum the
 land and plantation whereon I now live containing by estimation three
 hundred Acres to him and his heirs for ever I also I give to my Son
 William Baynum a Negro girl called and known by the name of Little
 Lucy to him & his heirs for ever
 Item I Give and bequeath to my Daughter Ann my Negro
 Boy called Jacob and to his heirs for ever provided nevertheless
 it is my desire that if my Daughter Ann should die without issue
 of her body lawfully begotten that then the said Negro doe
 return to my estate and be considered as part thereof and be ac-
 cordingly divided amongst my Children
 Item I Give and bequeath to my son John and to his heirs for
 ever my Negro girl called Amy Also after the death of
 beloved Wife Martha I give and bequeath to my Son John my
 Negro called Tommy to him and his heirs for ever
