In the name of God Amen I John Turner of  
the County of Southampton and Parish of St. Lukes being sick of Body  
but of sound and disposing mind thanks be to Almighty God for  
the same do make and ordain this to be my last Will and Testament  
1635 After my funeral expenses are defrayed and just debts paid  
I leave of my worldly Goods both real and personal which it shall  
please God of his infinite goodness and mercy to bestow on me in  
the following manner to wit

Item I give and bequeath to my son Joseph Turner my negroe  
man called Pompey and to his heirs for ever and Whereas I have  
here a said Negroe to the widow Nicholson provided I shall die  
part this life before the first day of January next then give the said  
Mary Money I have here the said Pompey for to my said Son to be

Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Selah Moulthrop a certain  
girl called Ann a chil said girl my said Daughter has had in her  
possession sometime (my desire is that he shall have part) to her and  
her heirs for ever

Item Whereas I have already given my son James Turner a suffi-  
cient part of my estate which he has had in his possession some  
time my desire is that he shall have no part of my estate

Item I give and bequeath to my son John Turner my Negroe  
man called Caesar to him and his heirs for ever

Item I give and bequeath to my son Jacob Turner my Negroe  
girl called Lucy and a debt I charge my son James Turner with of  
Twenty pounds Virginia money which he the said James borrows  
of me (which may be proven by Michael Wilkins) and I hereby  
enforce my son Jacob to demand or bring suit obtain Judgment  
against the said James Turner for the said £20 and receive &  
convey the same to his own use without putting my Good to any  
hurte about it

Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Mary Turner my negroe  
woman called Phillis and to her heirs also a feather bed and furniture

Item I give to my Negroe son William Turner my Negroe man  
called Harry to him and his heirs Likewise I give and bequeath to my  
son William Turner part of my clear pond tract of land granted to  
me by Patent beginning at a Willow or live Oak on Riddell's Branch  
to the Meadow then up the South West prong of the said Branch  
to a Sill near the Clear pond then a straight course through the  
Clear pond to George Branch then down the said Branch and up the  
Mistpond branch &c to the beginning to him the said William and  
to his heirs for ever Also six head of Cattle

Item I give to my daughter Charlotte Anna my Negroe  
girl called Jenny and to his heirs

Item I give to my daughter Elizabeth Gunn the labor of  
my Negroe girl called Maggie and the labor of her increase  
during her natural life and when she the said Elizabeth depart  
this life then I give my said Negroe girl called Maggie together  
with her future increase to be equally divided between all the  
children my said daughter Elizabeth shall then be the mother

Item I give and bequeath to my Son Amos Turners my  
Negroe Boy called Ned One feather bed and furniture six head  
of Cattle one Iron pot 2 porter dishes 1d Basin 4 a plates my  
Serrile Cole 1000 & Sol of the crop made the last year which is now  
in my Barns and twenty five pounds cash
