In the name of God Amen I Henry Ivy of the County
of Southampton and parish of St. Lukes being weak of body
but of sound and disposing mind thanks be to god for the same
do make and ordain this to be my last will and Testament
desiring the true intent and meaning to be executed. Vizt,

Imprimis after my funeral expences are asrayd and just debts
paid I dispose of my worldly goods both real and personal
which it hath pleased Almighty god of his infinite mercy &
goodness to bestow on me in manner and form following
to Wit)

Item I Give and bequeath to my son George Ivy all my
land which lies on the South side of the main road which
leads from M^{rs} Sarah Nicholson to Dover James Leas's Rectory
containing as is estimated 20 or 20 Acres be the same more or less to
him the said George and to his heirs for ever

Item I Give and bequeath to my son John Ivy apart of my
land lying as follows to Wit beginning at a small white oak
in the line between my land and my son Johns then along
a line of marked trees marked by my orders to a large pine
in a branch then up the various corners of the Branch to my
said sons Johns line head whither I take the same more or
less to him the said John Ivy and to his heirs for ever

Item I Give and bequeath to my son Robert Ivy my
plantation wherein I now live containing as is estimated
two 213 Acres be the same more or less, all the remainder
of my land adjoining the same is therein included to him
the said Robert Ivy and to his heirs for ever
