Item my desire is that after my just debts and funeral  
expenses are discharge'd that all the remaining part of my  
estate be sold and after my loving wife Fortune taking her  
third part that the remainder be equally divided between my  
son Ethredred and my daughter Elizabeth Avery.

I do hereby appoint my friend Shawell Edmunds to be my whole  
and sole Executor of this my last will and testament hereby  
reserving all others by me before made leaving them to be
