In the name of God amen I Bridgman Joyner of the County of Southampton Virginia being sick and weak of body but sound and perfect mind and memory calling to mind the uncertainties of this body and knowing that it is appointed for all men to die do think proper to make and ordain this my last will and testament in manner and form following to wit

I st Give devise and bequeath unto my loving wife Mary Joyner the use and profits of the plantation and land I bought of Jesse Council also my negro man slave called Tim and one safe for and during the term of her natural life or widowhood likewise one feather bed and furniture one table three pewter dishes three plates one hogs candlestick one cow one half my hogs to her and to her heirs and assigns for ever also one Black trunk with every thing. He purchased her self now in my possession
