In the name of god amen I Thomas Davis Junr.  
of Southampton County being sick and weak but of sound mind &  
memory do make and ordain this as and for my last will and  
testament and with such goods as it hath pleased god to bestow  
me I give and despose of as follows

I Give to my daughter Anne Davis one feather bed and furniture  
two Cows and Calves and four sheep which is in her possession  
now

I Give to my son Phillip Davis one feather bed and furniture  
two Cows and Calves six sheep one Young mare named Brown  
also a all my Slavers tools

I Give to my daughter Elizabeth Davis one feather bed and  
furniture two Cows and Calves and four sheep

I Give to my wife Hannah Davis on horse named Jack with  
Bridle and saddle three Cows and Calves and four sheep and  
one feather bed and furniture also the use and labour of two  
negro named Sinah and Anny during her natural life and  
after her death to be equally divided amongst my three children  
and their heirs forever Also my will and desire that the  
remainder part of my estate not heretofore mentioned may be sold  
and after all my just debts being paid to be equally divided  
between my wife and children Likewise constituted and affixed  
my son Phillip Davis Executor of this my last will and testa-  
ment Revoking all other wills before made by me Given under  
my hand and seal this seventeenth day of September 1776
