perfect sense and memory do make this my last will and testament
in manner following

I give unto my son Edwin Kennebrow all the money
that may arise from the sale of a young mare saddle and bridle 2
Banells of Corn and small bed and furniture to him and his heirs
for ever

I give unto my son Lot Kennebrow two of my best hags to
him and his heirs for ever

I desire that all the rest of my estate be sold by my
Executors hereafter to be mention'd and after paying me just debts
if there should be any money remaining I give that unto my
grand daughter Polly Kennebrow to her and her heirs forever

I do appoint my friend Benjamin Blunt Executor of this my
last will and testament in witness whereof I have hereunto
set my hand and affixed my seal this twentieth day of November
one thousand seven hundred and seventy six
