and County of Southampton being weak of body but of perfect sense and
memory praised be almighty god for it but knowing the uncertainty of our
being here do make this my last will and testament as followeth
disannulling and revoking all other will or wills heretofore made by me

Imprimis I give and bequeath my soul to god that gave it me relying
on the merits of my blessed saviour to have full remission of my sins and
my body to this earth to be buried at the discretion of my Executors hereafter
named

Item my will and desire is that all my estate in what soever manner
it lyeth or may be found that is to say all my personal estate and re-
gards may be sold to the highest bidders and the money arising from the
Sale thereof to be equally divided between all my sister Phoebe Lundy
Children. to them and their heirs for ever

Item I do constitute and appoint my brother in law Byrd Lundy
and George Lundy my Executors of this my last will and Testament
ratifying and confirming this to be my last will and testament
In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affix my seal
this 20th day of November 1775.

At a Court held for the County of Southampton the 13th February 1777
This Will was presented in Court by Byrd Lundy one of the executors
named and proved by the oaths of Edward Stanis Edward Lundy and Solon
Harrison the witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded and on the
motion of the said Executor who made oath according to law Certificate is
granted him for obtaining a probat thereof in due form giving security
Whereupon the said Byrd Lundy with Edward Lundy his security
entered into and acknowledg'd their Bonds in the penalty of One thousand
pounds for the due and faithfull administration of the decedents estate
and performance of his will
