of late Kennebec deceased to wit: Two negroes called Khamer two
horses 30 Barrels of Corn and crock of Blawes 18 gallons of Brandy
one bed and furniture one Cow two Hogs 6 geese one set of Cloths of several
kind crop of Cotton one saddle Bonds and accounts to the amount of
£18- other sundry things too tedious to mention

In the name of God amen I Joshua Claud of S^t Lukes parish
and County of Southampton being weak of body but of perfect sense and
memory praised be almighty god for it but knowing the uncertainty of our
being here do make this my last will and testament as followeth
disannulling and revoking all other will or wills heretofore made by me

I hereby give and bequeath my soul to god that gave it me relying
on the merits of my blessed saviour to have full remission of my sins and
my body to this earth to be buried at the discretion of my Executors hereafter
named

Item my will and desire is that all my estate in what so ever manner
it byeth or may be found that is to say all my personal estate and re-
grees may be sold to the highest bidder and the money arising from the
sale thereof to be equally divided betwixt all my sister Phoebe Lundy
Children ^{jointly} to them and their heirs for ever

Item I do constitute and appoint my brother in law Byrd Lundy
and Gury Lundy my Executors of this my last will and Testament
ratifying and confirming this to be my last will and testament my
Inwitness whereof I have herunto set my hand and affixt my seal
this 20th day of November 1775. Joshua Claud

A Court held for the County of Southampton the 13th February 1777
This Will was presented in Court by Byrd Lundy one of the Exors therein
named and proved by the oaths of Edward Harris Edward Lundy and Solo-
mon Harris their witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded and on the
motions of the said Exor who made oath according to law Certificate is
granted him for obtaining a probat thereof in due form giving Security
Whereupon the said Byrd Lundy with Edward Lundy his security
entred into and acknowledged their Bonds in the penalty of One thousand
pounds for the due and faithfull administration of the decedents estate
and performance of his will
