In the name of god amen William Harrison of Southampton County being sick and weak the perfect in sense and memory do make and appoint this my last will and Testament in manner and form following

I give and bequeath my soul to god that gave it me and my body to a decent Burial and as for what worldly goods he Lord hath endowed me with in the manner following

I give to my Brother Henry Harrison during his natural life for his paying to my Brother Benjamin Richard and Pathaniel Harrison on the sum of Thirty pounds to each of them my plantation and all my lands and after his decease to his son Henry Harrison to him and his heirs forever

I give and bequeath to my Brother Richard Harrison my least Cote to him and his heirs forever

I give and bequeath to my sister Sarah M^{rs} Lomax the sum of Ten pounds to her and her heirs forever

I give to Henry the son of Henry Harrison the sum of Three pounds for to school him

My desire is that the rest of my estate be sold and after my just debts paid to be equally divided between my Brothers Benjamin Henry Richard and Pathaniel Harrison

I do constitute and appoint my Brother Henry and Nich^l Harrison Executors of this my last will In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and fixed my seal this fourth day of June in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and seventy seven Signed Sealed and delivered
