

the use profit and labour of my negro girl Rose and the use and labour of one third part or share of the said William in my slaves aforesaid and also the negro Rose to be equally divided between all the children that he may leave at his death and their heirs for ever

I also give and devise to my son Laurence Joyner the lands and plantation whereon he now lives containing about two hundred acres to him and his heirs for ever I give to my son — — — Laurence Joyner the use profit and labor of a negro girl named Sarah and the use profit and labour of one other third part of all my remaining slaves living at my death for the term of his natural life and after his death I give the part or share of the said Laurence of my slaves aforesaid and also the negro Sarah to be equally divided between all the children of the said Laurence that he may leave at his death and to their heirs for ever I also give him one bed and furniture

I also give and devise to my son Jethro Joyner after the death of my wife Ann the lands and plantation wherein I now live for and during the term of his natural life only and after his death I give the said lands and plantation to the first son of the said Jethro that shall live to attain the age of twenty one years and to his heirs for ever

I also give and devise to my said son Jethro Joyner the use profit and labour of a negro girl named Phill and the use profit and labor of one other third part of all my remaining slaves living at the time of my death for the term of his natural life and after his death I give the part or share of the said Jethro of my remaining slaves as aforesaid and also there no slave to be equally divided between all the children both he the said Jethro may leave at the time of his death and their heirs for ever and for want of such children or issue to be equally divided between the children or issue of my sons William and Laurence and their heirs

I also give to Ann Joyner daughter of my brother Lewis Joyner one cow and Calf and six pounds Cash to be paid by my executors when she attains the age of eighteen or manis And all the rest residue and remainder of my estate of what nature or kind soever I give devise and bequeath to be equally divided between my three sons William Laurence and Jethro and their heirs for ever

I hereby constitute and appoint my said three sons executors of this my last will and testament revoking all others by me hitherto made
