Item I give and bequeath unto my two sons Littleton Fort and Turner Fort after deducting seven pound sixteen Shillings for Samuel Fort the residue of my estate consisting of one house cattle hog & Sheep corn cotton & lace pewter & large pott about 17½ bushels of salt & sundry furniture a quantity of brandy & bag of feathers & sundry other articles being first sold and the money to be equally divided between them and if either Littleton or Turner should decease before they arrive to the age of twenty one years the other shall have his estate the aforesaid leg acists them & their heirs forever My will and desire is that my just debts be first paid and my body to be decently buried at the discretion of my Executors here after mentioned In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this twentieth day of October 1777
