In the Name of God Amen I James Wright of the county of Southampton in the state of Virginia being sick & weak out of sound mind and perfect Memory do make & declare this to be my last will & Testament in manner and form as followeth Viz<sup>th</sup>

- 1<sup>st</sup> I give to my grand son John Wright son of James Wright five shillings
- 2<sup>nd</sup> I give to my son Joseph Wright five shillings
- 3<sup>rd</sup> I give to my daughter Martha Conner five shillings to be their full share of my whole estate not to come in for any other part of my estate
- 4<sup>th</sup> I give to my grand son James Wright two hundred acres of land being the plantation now known with all profits to the same belonging to him & his heirs forever
- 5<sup>th</sup> I give to my dear beloved wife Mary Wright all my personal Estate during her natural life to her own disposal And I do further appoint my son Joseph Wright my sole Executor of this my last will & Testament and I do hereby revoke & make void all former wills by me heretofore made & do establish this to be my last will of testament In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & affixed my seal this 9 day of January 1778 one thousand seven hundred & Seventy eight
