In the name of god Amen I Edward Lundy of the parish of Saint Luke
 in the County of Southampton being sick and weak but of Sound and
 disposing memory do make this my last will and testament as followeth
 I lend to my beloved wife the use of four Negroes viz. Hannah, resey, Lidia
 & Oliver, also four feather beds & furniture, also one gray mare forty head of
 four pots one pun three Chests and all the Corn and Bacon that is on the
 plantation her natural life, also the use of my land & plantation but if she
 marries to have only her thirds of the said land and plantation, also two flax
 wheels one flax haccle three woolling wheels four pair of cards ten head of Char-
 tle and all my plantation utensils

I give and bequeath unto my ^{my} Lundy's Lundy and plantation after the death
 or marriage of my wife to him and his heirs forever

I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Francis Lundy my Negro fellow
 Lewis when she comes to the age of twenty one years to her and her heirs forever

And I direct that the said Negro fello may be hired out until my Daughter
 Comes of age and the Money arising by the hire of the said Negro to be equally
 Divided Among all my Children together with all the ready money that shall
 be found at the time of her coming to age of twenty one to be equally divided
 among all my Children and all the rest & residue of my estate not before
 given away is to be sold by my executor hereafter mention and equally
 divided among all my Children except my daughter Francis Lundy
 and William Lundy executrix & executor of this my last will and testament

revoking all others before by me made In witness whereof I have hereunto
 set my hand and affixed my seal this 22 day of April 1778
