I give to my Son John Wellons the plantation whereon he now lives and the adjoining the same which is already marked off to the said plantation containing more or less two hundred and fifty Acres to him and his heirs forever and the goods and Chattles as have already possessed him to him and his heirs theirs forever

I give and bequeath unto my Son Henry Wellons the plantation whereon he now lives and the lands as I have already marked off to the plantation containing by estimation two hundred Acres more or less to him and his heirs forever. And all the goods and Chattles as I have already possessed him with to him and his heirs forever

I give unto my Son Charles Wellons all the plantation and land as now live on and all the said land and plantation as he now lives on containing by estimation two hundred Acres which be all the residue and remainder of my land of his mother my wife Anne Wellons and for enduring his Sisters Mary English

and she the said Mary shall have liberty to chose any part of this said land and plantation to live on and to cultivate as long as she the said Mary doth live single and after the death of his mother and the marriage of his Sister Mary I doth firmly give this said land and plantation to my said Son Charles Wellons before mentioned and all the goods & Chattles as have already possessed him with to him and his heirs forever.

I give unto my Daughter Mary Wellons two Chests and two feather beds and furniture & two cows & calves to her and her heirs forever and I also give unto the said Mary my Negro Girl as I now have named late after
