 god to bestow on I dispose of in manner & form following, viz
 In premis I give & bequeath to my loving daughter Betty Sammons
 one feather Bed and furniture & also my shoe makers tools to her and her
 heirs forever

Item I leave all my Carpenters and Coopers tools and gun to be equally
 Divided between my three Children Isaac Rawlings Mary Adams and
 Betty Sammons to them and their heirs and assigns forever.

Item The rest and Residue of my living Real and personal I lend
 to my loving wife Mary Rawlings during her natural life & then
 to be equally divided among my loving Children aforesaid to them and
 their heirs forever.

And lastly I do Nominate And appoint my loving Son Isaac Rawlings
 & my Son in law Thomas Adams Executors of this my last will and
 testament hereby me Revoaking and making void all former
 wills by me made In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand
 & affixed my Seal this 17th Day of September 1777
