Item I give and bequeath to my Son Henry Taylor One Negro Boy Called Jemie

Item I give and bequeath to my Son Henry Taylor One hundred Acres of land divided from the Old plantation by a new line of marked trees On the South side of Arons branch and One Negro man Called Jacob

Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter Sarah Lisle One negro Girl Called Jenny

Item I give & bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth Edwards One negro Boy Called Regan

Item I give & bequeath to my son Thomas Taylor forty Acres of land in Carraro percession and One Negro boy Called Tom one Bed and furniture

Item I send to my Dear beloved wife Lucy Taylor the plantation whereon I now live containing 45 Acres of land likewise my part of the mill two Negromen toby and Dick two Negro women Louice & Leade and the rest of my estate consisting of Cattle hogs & Sheep household goods and at her death my will is that my part of the Mill I have lent should return back to my son Henry Taylor and the 45 Acres of land to return to my son Thomas Taylor and the remainder of my estate to be equally divided Amongst my beloved Children

Item I do hereby appoint my Son Henry Taylor my whole and sole executor and I do ordain this my last will and testament of which I have hereunto set my hand and Seal this eighth day of November one thousand Seven hundred and Seven Signed Sealed and Delivered to be the last will of the Subscriber in the presents of
