I give and bequeath to my Daughter Sarah Lisle one negro girl called Jenny

I give & bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth Edwards one negro Boy called Regis

I give & bequeath to my son Thomas Taylor forty Acres of land in Carrara perca-
 son and one Negro boy called Tom one Bed and furniture

I give to my Dear beloved wife Lucy Taylor the plantation whereon I now live
 containing 45 Acres of land likewise my part of the mill two Negro men toby and Dick
 two Negro women Louice & Leah and the rest of my estate consisting of Cattle hogs
 & Sheep household goods and at her death my will is that my part of the Mill I have
 lent should return back to my son Henry Taylor and the 45 Acres of land to return
 to my son Thomas Taylor and the remainder of my estate to be equally divided amongst
 my beloved Children

I do hereby appoint my Son Henry Taylor my whole and sole executor and
 I do ordain this my last will and testament of which I have here unto set my hand
 and Seal this eighteenth day of November one thousand Seven hundred and Seven
