In the name of God Amen I Leonard Oney of the parish of Nottoway in the County of Southampton being of Sound & disposing mind & memory do make & ordain this writing as & for my last will & testament hereby revoking all other wills by me hitherto made in manner & form following first I give & devise to my three daughters Lucy Martha & Hannah the plantation whereto I now live with fifty Acres of Land adjoining the same so long as they or either of them remain single or unmarried to be possessed by such single or unmarried daughter only and after the death or marriage of all my said daughters I give the said plantation with the Lands adjoining to my Son Thomas Oney & his heirs & assigns forever I also give the remained part of the tract of Land whereon I now live to wit eighty Acres of land the whole containing One hundred & thirty Acres of Land to my said Son Thomas Oney & to his heirs And assigns forever Also I give & bequeath to my said daughters aforesaid the use & labour of my Negro man Sampson so long as they or either of them remain single & unmarried - and after the marriage or death of all my said daughters I hereby direct that the said negro Sampson be sold by my executors and the money arising by his Sale to be equally divided between all my children male & female then alive I give my Son Thomas Oney the sum of twenty Shillings I give to my Son John Oney the Sum of twenty Shillings I give my Son Benjamin Oney the Sum of twenty Shillings I give to my daughter Lucy Oney four new Bottom Chairs one feather Bed & furniture & chest I give to my Daughter Martha one feather Bed & furniture I give to my Daughter Hannah one feather Bed & furniture I give to my three daughters Lucy Martha & Hannah or such of them as may remain single & unmarried my Horse all my fowls one pot & one pan three Cows & calves three Sows & piggs with such Hogg as may be fit for killing together with the crop that may be made or standing at my death together with the cart & wheels and all the rest & remainder of my estate of what nature or kind soever I give to be equally divided between my two married daughters to wit Elizabeth the wife of John Atkinson & Mary the wife of James Atkinson I appoint my Son Thomas Oney executor of this
