

In the Name of God Amen, I David Burr of Southampton County 5th January of
 1779 being sick & weak of body but of sound perfect sense & memory calling to mind the mortality of
 uncertainty of this life & that it is appointed for all men once to die & I think proper to
 make Constitutions & declare this my last Will & Testament in Manner & form following to wit
 Item, I give unto my Son David Burr two Shillings & Six pence Current Money of Virginia
 to him & his heirs forever
 Item, I give the Lawfull heir of my Daughter Martha Whales two Shillings & Six pence
 to him & his heirs forever
 Item, I give to my Daughter Eliza Massons Lawfull heir two Shillings & Six pence to them
 & their heirs forever
 Item, I give to my Daughter Rebecca Vaughn two Shillings & Six pence to her & her
 heirs forever
 Item, I give to my Daughter Mary Council two Shillings & Six pence to her & her heirs forever
 Item, I give to the Lawfull heir of my Son Samuel Burr two Shillings & Six pence
 to them & their heirs forever
 Item, I give to my Son Harry Burr two Shillings & Six pence to him & his heirs forever
 Item, I leave to my loving Wife my Negro woman named Hannah & my Negro woman
 named Leah to my 2^d wife Patience Burr during her natural life & after her Death
 the 2^d two Negroes & their Increase to be equally divided between my two Daughters
 Ann Burr & Sarah Council to them & their heirs forever
 Item, I give to my Daughter Ann Burr one Negro Girl named Molly to her & her heirs forever
 Item, I give to my loving Wife Patience Burr one Negro Girl named Pate to her & her heirs forever
 Item, I give all the remainder of my Estate after my wife die^{sd} to be equally divided
 between my two Daughters Ann Burr & Sarah Council to them & their heirs forever
 Lastly I do hereby nominate & ordain my son in law Cuthbert Council my whole &
 sole Executor of this my last Will & Testament Resolving all other Wills & Wills hereafter
 made by me in Mischance whereof I have heretofore set my hand & affixed my seal this 2^d
 Day of October One thousand Seven hundred & Seventy Nine David Burr Seal
 Signed sealed & delivered At a Court held for the County of Southampton March
 the 11th Day of Nov^r 1779 This Will was presented in Court by
 The said Cuthbert Council the Executor therein named & approved by the Oath of
 Cuthbert Council & Joseph Mountfort the Witnesses thereto & ordered to
 be Recorded And on the motion of the 2^d Executor who made oath according
 to law Certificate is granted him for obtaining a Patent in due form Giving
 Security whereupon he

 Signed sealed published pronounced and delivered by the said Patience Burr to be her last Will
 & Testament
