Mind & Memory, do make & give in this my last Will & Testament in Manner and
In the following Way:

I give to my Wife Martha Smith the Use of my Slave Negroes hereafter named
W^l Ben, Sally, Sam, Davis, Bob, Uriah, Amos, Natty, Charles, Joe, Harry, Until the said
Slaves arrive to the Age of Thirty one, at which time my Will deems it that all Young
of above Negroes should be set free particularly at their Arrival at thirty One years of age.
Item, I give the use of my Negro Woman Millie to my Wife Martha Smith Until the first
Day of January One Thousand Seven hundred & Eighty four, at which time my Will deems it
that the Negro Woman Millie should be set free.

Item, I give the Use of my Negro Young Dick to my Wife Martha Smith Until the first
Day of January One Thousand Seven hundred & Eighty four, at the Expiration of which
time my Will deems it that the said Dick should be free.

Item, I give to my Wife Martha Smith the Land of Plantation wherem I now live with
all the Appurtenances thereto belonging Likewise a Tract of Land I bought of Benjamin
Holliman to her of her lifetime, I give the same to my Wife Martha Smith all the
Remainder of my Estate to be of Use as a residence to her of her lifetime forever, & then
Constitute & appoint my Wife Martha Smith of Joshua Bailey my Whole Will Executing
After this my last Will & Testament Reciting and making void all former
Will herefore by me made. In witness whereof I have signed & set my hand & affixed my
Seal the Day and year first of above written.
