Chamber the first two Month & Half my Negro Woman Servt & all Bedds to him of
her Service also One Bed of Furniture of Brass & One Pewter Dish & other
Plate and Mone Saddles One Large Plat Belong to him of her Service forever.

I give & Bequeath the use of my Negro woman Servt with her Other Incomes to my beloved
wife Sally Sturgess During her Natural Life and at her Death the said Negro
Woman shall both her Other Incomes to be Equally Divided Between my two
Sons John Williams Surgeon & William Surgeon to them of their Service forever.

I give to my beloved wife Sally Sturgess the Wreath Wheel & Card One Boat Wheel
Whell and Hackles also Cotton & Wool & all the remainder of my Pewter not
herte, Inc. Mentioned.

I have all my weareing Apparell made fit for me to the Definition of my Wife
to divide Between my Children. To soe have all my Books Call & Cork for the
use of my Family the ensuing Year in Care of my Servt, hereafter Mentioned.
Please all the rest of my Estate Not yet Mentioned to be sold at publick Sale by
my Executors & after my just Debts are Paid the Remainder to be Equally divided
between my Wife & Children and that my Devise is that my Children in Schools
out of their Proportion of this Division - And in case my wife shoule be in
want of any necessary for her support my will & desire is that she take the use
of such necessary During her Widowhood. Or till my Son William Should Arrive
to the Age of Twenty one and then to be sold and Equally Divided Between my
Childe & Children.

And I appoint my loving Wife Sally Sturgess and my Friend Wm Blunt
my whole and sole Executore to this my last Will & Testament Disannulling
all & Will I have before me made In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand
and affixed my Seal this 20 day of October in the Year of our Lord 1779.
