Thank be given to Almighty God for the same do make and constitute
this my last Will & Testament in form hereinafter following, In witness
I give & bequeath unto
My plantation whereon he now lives; also what stock he has in
possession and also what household Furniture & plantation
Articles he has on the plantation

Item, I give & bequeath unto my Son Shadrach and his heirs forever
the Land & plantation whereon I now live, also what stock, household
Furniture and plantation articles I have in my possession on the S.
Land & plantation also one Negro man named Adam.

My will I give furthermore is that my Will be applied to the use
of my three sons, namely, Arthur, Samuel, & Shadrach as each may
have occasion Also what Money I owe are due to me be divided
equally between my three Sons aforesaid Lastly I appoint my
Sons Arthur & Samuel Executors of this my last Will & Testa-
ment In witness whereof I have set my hand & affixed my seal
this 9th Day April 1774.

At a Court held for the County of South-
ampton the 14th Day of Oct^r 1780.
This Will was presented in Court by
Samuel Vick the Ex^r therein named
and proved by Oaths of Geo. Gwynne
& Thos. Cammude two of the witnesses
thereto & ordered to be Recorded and
on the motion of the said Ex^r who made
Oath according to Law Certificate is
granted him for obtaining a probat in
due form giving Severely whereupon

County being in perfect mind and memory do make and publish this my Will and Testament
in manner & form as follows

I hereby give to my two Sons Samuel Morgan & John Morgan the plantation
whereon I now live to them & their heirs forever, and my Devise is that if either
of them Die without his part may fall to the other & if of
them I give & bequeath to my son William Morgan my plantation lying on Browns
branch joining William Turner, to him & his heirs forever.

Item, My Devise is that my Negro Woman Phillis should be sold a publick
Sale, and the Money Arising thereon to be Equally divided between my
four Daughters Patience Elizabeth Sarah & Ann.
