

Also I give to Elizabeth Morris a Negro man named Rogers to her and her heirs.
Also I give to Mary Bass daughter of Arthur Bass and to her heirs or heirs name
Lacey and her future increase.

Also I give to Charles Adams Peter Adams and Collin Adams four of Mary Adams
the their heirs equally to be divided between them the following Slaves viz
Pat Dick, Melly, Herbert, Nat John, George, Lewis, & Henry. The division to be
made as soon as convenient after my decease by my friends Daniel Fisher
James Thos, William Bland, John Rogers & John Myrick or any three of them.

Also the division of my estate of what nature sever whether real or personal I give
may be sold and the money equally to be divided between the aforesaid boys Charles
Adams Peter Adams & Collin Adams. But should either of them die under the age
of twenty one year I leave the slaves and estate before given then should go to the
survivors or survivors of them and should they all die under the age a few years then
I give the same to James Lundy Melly Lundy & Sarah Lundy before mentioned
equally to be divided between them or in case of their death the children either
may come to receive their parents portion.

Also I do hereby appoint James Lundy & Christian Morris my executors of this my
last will & Testament. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal
this fourteenth day of March 1780

In the Name of God Amen, I Will. Atkinson being in my perfect health
sense and memory do make this my last Will and Testament as followeth.
I give and bequeath unto my loving Wife Mary Atkinson all my Land on the North side
of the Mill branch except the one half of my Apple and Peach Orchard during her
natural life.
I give and bequeath unto my son Joseph Atkinson all my Land on the
South side of the Mill branch and one half of my Apple & Peach Orchard on
the Land that I have lent to my wife and at my wife's death I give him the same
that I have lent my wife, and one half of my Saddle Cows, one bed and furniture
one Sled Horse Coll, one Cow and calf, one Sow and pig, one Mare and Saddle
& bridle, one paster Dick, Bawm & three pecker, one Iron pot, one Roe and Lamb.
one quond stone and one top to him and his heirs forever, on Condition that he shall
well pay my son William Atkinson four thousand pounds of neat inspected Tobacco
at the time that he William arrive to the age of twenty one year, and likewise pay
to my son John Atkinson four thousand pounds of neat inspected Tobacco at the time
that he John arrive to the age of twenty one Year.
I give and bequeath unto my son William Atkinson four thousand pounds of neat inspected
Tobacco to be paid by my son Joseph Atkinson at the time that he William arrive
to the age of twenty one Year, and one bed and furniture to him & his heirs forever.
