Item, I give unto my loving wife all the remainder of my Estate after my
just debts are paid to her and her three givers.

I leave my Son William I leave in power to arrive to the age of twenty
one years I desire that the debt I have given him should be paid to my Son
John I leave my Son John should die before he comes to the age of
twenty one years then I desire that the debt I have given him be paid unto
my Son William I leave my Son Joseph should receive or neglect to pay
the debt before mentioned to my Son William & John then I desire all
my Land may be sold & the Money arising from the sale thereof to be
to be equally divided between my sons Joseph, William & John Johnson
to them and to their three givers.

I do appoint my Son Joseph Johnson Executor of this my Last Will
and Testament in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and
seal this day of Dec^r 1780

At a Court held for the County of Kent the 12 day
of Apr^l 1781. This Will was presented in Court by Joseph Johnson the
Exor. thereof & proved by the Oath of James Chancellor & Joseph Whitehead two
of the High Sheriffs thereof and ordered to be Recorded. And on the motion of the
S^r Exor. who made oath according to Law Certificate is granted him for obtain-
ing a Probate in due form giving security whereupon be

of Kent being much of Body but of sound mind and Memory do hereby
appoint this to be my Last Will & Testament, in manner and form following to wit:
Item, I give & bequeath to my Son Timothy Thorpe one Negro man called Jack
Johnson two Cowshanks, to him & his heirs & assigns I give to my Son James
one Gray Horse called Parick, & assigns all my Pale & Peatier, One Dutch Oak
half a dozen leather bottom Chairs, half a dozen deep Quene Chintz plates half a
dozen Quene China Tea cups & saucers half a dozen silver tea spoons.

Item, I give and bequeath to my Grand Daughter Mary Cook Simmons one new Saddle
one Sheet one felt Blanket

Item, I give and bequeath to my Grand Daughter Peggy Ridley one new Chintz Blanket

Item, I direct that all the remainder part of my Estate of what kind soever, be sold
the Money be divided into seven Equal parts one part of which I give to my
Grand Daughter Rebecca Simmons & Mary Cook Simmons to be equally
divided between the two Sisters. On other part I give to my Grand Daughter
Peggy Ridley & Martha Ridley to be equally divided between them two Sisters
One other part I give to my Grand Daughter Mrs. Thorpe & Martha Thorpe to be equally
divided between them two Sisters. One other part I give to my Grand
Daughter Temperance Whitehead
