

Item after the above mentioned term of eight years is expired I leave all my Estate except my Lands and Negroes that is lent to my Wife for the term of eight years not otherwise content and reserved to be sold to the highest bidder and the Money arising from the Sale to be divided in the following manner, one third to my Wife and the other part to be equally divided between all my Children. I leave the remainder part of my Negroes that is to say after the term for which they are lent aforesaid may be if passably divided between all my Children by their good ones appointed by the Court. And my land of all lands which there is a Lot in Gifford's Town I give to my son Charles Briggs his heirs and to his heirs forever.

Item I leave the remainder part of my Estate may be equally divided between my Wife and all my Children.

Item I do constitute and appoint my Brother in Law Thomas Edmunds, of John Rixby and my good friend Henry Francis Executors of this my last will and Testament & my Wife who of have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this twelfth day of January 1781.

That Will was presented in Court by Thomas Edmunds, of John Rixby the Executors therein named by the will of Abraham Moore & Edwin Edward two of the Witnesses thereto and read the same. In the Name of God Amen, I Thomas Edwards of the Parish of Saint Luke and County of Southampton, being sick and weak of body but sound mind and memory, thanks be to God to Almighty God for the same do make and constitute this my last Will and Testament in form and manner following. I give and bequeath to my son Jordan and his heirs for ever his land and plantation whereon I have a house containing six extensives and hundred acres more or less. And if he should die without his lawfully begotten & his body, I then give and bequeath the said land and plantation to my son Newt and his heirs for ever. I also give my said son Jordan my cow mare, called Peg and the largest saddle and bridle, one feather bed and furniture, my hunting gun and two Bad Brandy which he had of Joseph Washington as his substitute in the said land. I give and bequeath to my son Benjamin all the several long lants, after my wife's death success to him and his heirs for ever, but provided he should die without his lawfully begotten & his body I give and bequeath the same to my son Newt and his heirs for ever. I also give my son Benjamin one house which I purchased at Popes vale, and the same smallest saddle and bridle, one feather bed and furniture, my long gun, also two barrels brandy and two in the hands of Thomas Taylor being what he was to receive of me as his substitute in the said land. I give unto my Daughter Mary one Cow and calf.

I give unto my Daughter Ann one Cow and calf and one Feather bed and Furniture.
