 together with my Wife Ann, what land is sufficient for herself and Family this present
 year a Boy man called the Indian and the Saddle and birds called live and one
 feathered old and two others. My desire for this more is that my two Sons Jordan &
 Benjamin continue with my said wife Ann this present year and assist at the gate
 a sufficiency of corn and fodder, if made on the Plantation, to support what stock
 they may have the ensuing Winter. As to the remainder of my estate and already
 decided of my desire is that it be equally divided I desire my said wife Ann &
 two Sons Jordan & Benjamin, except my dog house called Punks, which is to be sold at
 public sale and the money arising therefrom be applied by my Executors hereafter
 named, to purchase a Hatstand, a wooden cradle, a feather bed, and furniture for each
 of my three Daughters, Lucy, Elizabeth & Mary.

Lastly I appointed my wife Ann & Ben Benjamin Executors of this my last,
 Will and Testament and my friends William Thomas & George Gaily Trustees to
 see that this my Will and Testament be duly executed. In Witness whereof I have
 hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 10th day of March 1781.
