 five bottles and one leather pail and one Cyprus Pegg and one brass candle stick
 and brass pepper box and one glass salt cellar and one four gallon pot and one Kettle
 I then I give and bequeath unto John Right the son of Joseph Right one bed and furniture
 and two gallon pot and one basin and one dish and two plates and one earthen plate
 I then I give and bequeath unto my son Joseph Right all the remainder of my estate
 And I do appoint my son Joseph Right and John Dimes my sole and only executor
 to this my last will and Testament, I have hereunto set my hand and fixed my
 seal the 22^d day of Dec^r 1780.
