said Body River are Joining To wit I give to my said Sons the said land to be Equally divided & distributed
Item I give and bequeath to my Loving Son Sam Conitt the plantation with all the land
on the North side the great Branch with the said supposed Body River of land above mention
and joining the said Robert Williams land
Item I likewise give to my Loving Son Thomas Conitt one brown calf and one Feather bed one
Punter Dish
Item I likewise give to my Loving Son Sam Conitt one brown calf one feather bed one punter dish
Item I give to my Loving Daughter Ann Conitt one brown calf one feather bed one punter dish
Item I give to my Loving Daughter Elizabeth Conitt one brown calf one feather bed one punter dish
Item I give to my Loving Daughter Mary Conitt one brown calf one feather bed one punter dish
Item I give to my Loving Daughter Sarah Conitt one brown calf one feather bed one punter dish
Item I give and bequeath to my Loving Wife the whole Remainder of my Estate to her own disposal
