 to the remembrance the mortality of my body I do give and bequeath to my Son in the manner as  
 followeth first I bequeath my Soul to God who gave it and my body to Dr. Bevis. In a decent  
 manner according to the Cisternion of my Execution and With what worldly goods God hath been  
 pleased to endow me with and dispose of in manner and forme following he doth make  
 Item I give and bequeath to my Dearest Son Robert and Thomas Conwill all my land on the  
 South side the great Branch of Ruffabout Tring River that lies over a small Branch the  
 said party lies in Tring Robert Gillam lies the said land to be equally divided between them  
 Item I give and bequeath to my loving Son Edmund Conwill the plantation with all the land  
 on the North side the great Branch with the said supposed party lies of land above mentioned  
 and joining the said Robert Gillam land.

Item I likewise give to my loving Son Thomas Conwill one hundred and half acres of land in one  
 piece of land.

Item I likewise give to my loving Son Edmund Conwill one hundred and fifty acres of land in one  
 piece of land.

Item I give to my loving Daughter Ann Conwill one hundred and fifty acres of land in one piece of land.

Item I give to my loving Daughter Mary Conwill one hundred and fifty acres of land in one piece of land.

Item I give to my loving Daughter Penelope Conwill one hundred and fifty acres of land in one piece of land.

Item I give and bequeath to my loving Wife the whole remainder of my Estate after my own disposal  
 Item I do constitute and appoint my loving Wife Elizabeth Conwill and Son Thomas Conwill my  
 whole and sole Executrix of this my last Will and Testament in witness whereof I have caused  
 to be sealed and witnessed this Twenty fifth day of Oct 1778. Thomas Conwill *Sealed*

At a Court held for the County of Southampton the 13<sup>th</sup> day of Nov 1781 The Will  
 was presented in Court by Tho. Conwill his Executor thereupon is and passed the oaths of  
 John Gillam and John Gillam Esq of the Wimbley Plantation and ordered to be Recorded. And on  
 the motion of Tho. Conwill who made oath according to law Certificate was granted him for  
 sealing a Roll in due form giving Security wherepon *Sam Kell Co*

In the Name of God Amen I William Barker of the County of Elton and Parish of Elton being  
 weak of body the sound in understanding soeake therby lase will as follows And first I commis my  
 sole power and my Body to be buried at the direction of my Executors And do dispose of my worldly Goods  
 in the following manner I do bequeath unto my Wif Mary Barker all my personal estate of  
 household furniture Stock of Cattle Horses Fowles and Sheep likewise one Negro fellow And during  
 her life her Widowership and after her dea or Marriage to be Equally divided among all my six children  
 the Plantation wheroun I live along My Wifes Death to be sold and divided also among them all And  
 I do appoint Myself Mary Barker Richd Marks and Joseph Marks Executrix of this my  
 last will and Testament. Signed sealed and delivered in the presence of *Richard Marks*
