And I give to my son John a Negro Child formerly to have in possession at twenty years of age and I give to my said son John my Plantations in Southamptons County lying in the Capitalized manner to him his Heirs forever and my Justice Will and desire is that that my son may have the Interest of one half of my Personal Estates to hold him where he shall I give to my loving Wife Anna George the rest of my Estates during her life and after her death then all to go to my son; but in case should die without Heir, then to be equally divided between all my Children then their Heirs forever.
 I do also constitute and appoint Benjamin Spattley and Anna George Executors of this my last Will and Testament; and I do hereby disallow and revoke all and every other former bequeathed testifying and confirming this and no other before mentioned written and in witness whereof I have hereunto set my Hand and seal the day and year above written signed sealed and published as pronounced

 In the name of God amen I William Griffith of the Parish of Netley and County of Southamptons being at present of sound mind and memory and disquiet as also in my usual state of health, but well knowing the uncertainty of this life do make and again publish and declare this Instrument of Writing to be my last Will & Testament. I promise I give unto my beloved wife my manner Plantation whereon I now live with all the Land thereunto belonging during her life and after her death I give to my Son Matthew Griffith and his Heirs forever. I also give her all my household Furniture Whatever I have. I also give her all my stock both Cattle and Horses and after my just Debts are paid. I give her also all my Corn and Meat that I now have and all that I have due to me for Woolsheeping also every thing that I have now growing I leave it to the only proper use and behoof of her during life or widowhood and after her death, it is my desire that my Estate what little I have, should be equally divided by any three honest men into three parts my wife taking her part, whereas my Son Matthew Griffith or my Executors if he not of age
