In the Name of God Amen the 16th day of November Anno Dom 1781 I Francis Williamson of the County of the said County of Southampton being sick Weak in body but of perfect sense and sound Memory make & declare this my last will and Testament in manner and form following

I give to my Brother James Williamson all my Land lying in Groundville County to him and his heirs forever

I give to my Sister Polly Williamson One Negro woman called a Patience I shall to her and her heirs forever

I give to Mijah Williamson One Negro Slave to him and his heirs forever

I give to my Brother John Williamson One Negro man called a Charles together with all the Residue of my estate be it of what nature or kind soever to him & his heirs forever

I do here constitute and appoint Mijah Williamson my whole Sole Executor of this my last will and Testament writing and making void all and every other former Will and before by me made In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal the day and year first above written

At a Court held for the County of Southampton the 13th day of December 1781 This Will was presented in Court by Mijah Williamson the executor therein named and proved by the oath of Peter Williamson a Witness subscribed
