chest, One Card Table, Harrow, and the one half of my stock of sheep, to him
and his heirs forever.

Now I Give to my daughter Elizabeth Edwards two beds and a furniture mobile
Kettle Shillet and the one half of my wearing clothes to her and to heirs forever.

Now I Give to my daughter Ann Edwards two beds and a furniture half a dozen ^{spoon} spoons
and one half of my wearing clothes to her and to her heirs forever.

Now I Give to my sons Benjamin and my daughter Elizabeth and Ann Edwards
all my Estate to be equally divided between them to them and their heirs forever.

Now I desire that all the remaining part of my Estate be sold by Executors hereafter
to be mentioned and after paying my just debts and necessary Expenses, the
remainder of the money arising therefrom I Give to my four children namely
Richard Benjamin Elizabeth and Ann Edwards, to be equally divided between
them, to them and their heirs forever.

I do appoint my son William Edwards and my brother Benjamin Blount Executors
of this my last Will and Testament nothing all others by me hereby made. In
Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 26 day of
February 1782.
