 of my estate as followeth (Wilt)

Item first My will and desire is that all my Just debts be paid first and so leave  
 to the breast of My Executors to Dispose of any part of my Estate as they shall think conve-  
 nient to discharge the same.

Item second I give and bequeath to my Brother Turner Person One Negro girl name  
 Nancy to him and his heirs forever

Item fourth My will and desire is that all the remainder of my Estate both what  
 kind soever it will be whether Personal or Real to remain in the hands of my Executors until  
 my son Timothy Person arrives to the age of Twenty one years or my wife Temperance Person shall  
 Mary is depart this life by death. All the profits that shall come from my Estate I desire  
 may be equally divided between my wife Temperance Person my son Tim Person  
 my daughter Patsy Person until Timothy Person comes to Age or my wife  
 Mary's or dies and at the period of either of these last mention'd then my  
 desire is the said Estate be divided as followeth

Item third I leave to my belov'd wife Temperance Person my Mannor plantation  
 where I now live containing four hundred and seventy Acres Rising her  
 in a low state of life. Then after the decease of my wife Temperance Person  
 I give the above mentioned Land to my daughter Patsy Person to her and  
 her heirs forever
