In the name of God Amen I James Munroe of Southwestern being
 sick and weak last of several Words & Monies so make and constitute this
 as my last will and Testament — I Recommend my soul to God saying
 to The Quaker to be buried at the discretion of my Executors I wish regard
 to my worldly Goods with which it hath pleased God to endow me
 I dispose of as followeth — I Give to my loving Wife Sarah Ann Munroe
 all the slaves with their Increase which she had before Marriage with me
 to her and her heirs forever I also bind to her during her life all my other
 goods which I had before Marriage with her and should any suit
 appear against me which cannot be discharge with the debt which are
 due to me I desire that my wife may sell such of the last mentioned Goods
 as she pleases to discharge the same and at the death of my wife my will
 is that the said slaves be given to my Niece Elizabeth Poole to her and heirs
 forever — And in case of the death of my said Niece before my wife then I give
 the said Slaves to James Poole & William Joseph Poole or two of
 them then surviving to them & their heirs forever — ~~And~~ All my other
 Estate of what kind soever I Give to my loving wife to her & her heirs
 forever And lastly constitute my said wife with the said last Executor
 of this my last will and Testament settling all other wills heretofore
 made In Writing whereof I have been unto set my hand & affixed
 my seal this 24 day of April 1782
