WITNESS IN THE NAME OF GOD. AMEN. I James Murphy of Southampton being
 the first and weak led of sound mind & memory so make and constitute this
 my last will and Testament. I Recommend my soul to God by laying
 to the Grace to be bestowed at the resurrection of my carcass & with regard
 to my earthly Goods with which it hath pleased God to endow me
 I dispose of as follows. I give to my loving wife Susannah Murphy
 all the slaves with their Increases which she had before marriage with me
 to her and her heirs forever. I also leave to her during her life Among other
 slaves which I had before marriage with her and should any still
 appear against me which cannot be accounted with the above which are
 due to me I desire that my wife may sell such of the last mentioned slaves
 as she pleases to account the same and at the death of my wife my will
 is that the said slaves be given to my Niece Mrs. Rose Johnson
 forever. And in case of the death of my said Niece before my wife then by
 the said Niece I am to pay to Mrs. Rose Johnson the sum of £100 per Annum
 When she ceasing to them & his living forever. I direct also that the
 Estate of what kind so ever I give to my loving wife to be her
 forever. And lastly constitute my said wife which I do & dole Executive
 of this my last Will and Testament making all other writings
 made. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & affixed
 my seal this 13 day of April 1782. James Murphy (Seal)
