In the NAME of GOD AMEN I John Ivy of the County of Southampton being weak of
Body but sound and disposing sense and mind thank be to Almighty God for the same do make and ordain
this to be my last Will and Testament Vizt ~

Imprimis after my funeral expenses are defrayed and just debts paid I dispose of my Warrably goods both real and
personal which it hath pleased god of his infinite mercy and goodness to bestow on me in
the following manner(s) to wit

Item I give to my beloved wife Elizabeth Ivy during her natural life the feather Bed wherein she
generally lies and the furniture thereunto belonging. Her side Saddle and my Great leather Purse

Item Give and Bequeath to my Daughter Priscilla Bullock a bed which she calls her own that has in her self

Item I give and bequeath to my Son James Ivy apart of my land lying on the south side Great Plough
Man Swamp being the north part of my tract of land wherein I now live and divided
from the South part thereof by a line of marks to which I made last week in presence
of my Neighbors Thomas Pate and Edward Pate the said line begins at a tree called red-oak
in the line that divides John Rees's land from mine and runs near a south west course to
a red oak an Elbow tree in the line that divides Ambrose Giffards land from mine con-
taining as is esteemed 108 acres be the same more or less to him the said James Ivy and
to his heirs forever

Item I give and bequeath to my Son John Ivy and to his heirs forever all the remainder part
of my Land lying between the 2. new line above mentioned and the Little Ploughman
Swamp containing as is esteemed 108 acres be the same more or less

Item I desire all the remainder part of my estate in whatsoever manner it lyeth or may be found to
be sold for ready money and the money arising from the Sale thereof to be equally divided
between my wife Elizabeth Ivy and my Children David Ivy Anne Morgan Priscilla
Bullock and Rebecca Ivy

Item I desire my Estate no estate appraised

Item I do constitute and appoint my well beloved friend Joshua Nicholson my whole sole
executor of this my last Will and testament in witness whereof I have hereunto set my
hand and affixed my seal this Fourth day of March 1780
