In the name of God amen I John Basy of the County of Southampton being weak of Body but of sound and disposing sense and mind thanks be to Almighty God for the same do make and ordain this to be my last Will and testament vizt.

After my funeral expenses are defrayed and just debts paid I dispose of my worldly goods both real and personal which it hath pleased God of his infinite mercy and goodness to bestow on me in the following manner (to wit)

I Give and bequeath to my wife Elizabeth Basy during her natural life the feather Bed whereon she generally lies and the furniture thereunto belonging, her side Saddle and my smallest Iron Pot

I Give and bequeath to my Daughter Priscilla Bullock a bed which she calls her own that has in it 20 ft.

I Give and bequeath to my Son James Basy a part of my land lying on the south side Great Ploughman Swamp being the north part of my tract of land whereon I now live and divided from the South part thereof by a line of mark trees which I made last week in presence of my Neighbours Thomas Pate and Edward Pate the said line begins at a large red oak in the line that divides John Rees's land from mine and runs near a south west course to a red oak an Elm tree in the line that divides Ambrose Griggards land from mine containing as is estimated 102 Acres be the same more or less to him the said James Basy and to his heirs forever

I Give and bequeath to my Son John Basy and to his heirs forever all the remainder part of my Land lying between the 2^d new line above mentioned and the Little ploughman Swamp containing as is estimated 102 acres be the same more or less

I desire all the remainder part of my estate in whatsoever manner it lyeth or may be found to be sold for ready money and the money arising from the Sale thereof to be equally divided between my wife Elizabeth Basy and my Children Dary Basy Anne Morgan Priscilla Bullock and Rebecca Basy

I desire my Estate to be appraised

I do constitute and appoint my well beloved Friend Joshua Nicholson my whole sole execution of this my last Will and testament in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this fourth day of March 1780
