

In the Name of God. I Phillip Moody of Southampton County Virginia
being sick and weak of body but of sound and disposing mind and memory, and calling to mind
the uncertainty of this temporary life and knowing that all men must die do make and appoint to
make this my last will and testament in manner and forms following to wit.

I give devise and bequeath to my son Samuel Moody all that part of the plantation and lands
that I bought of William Barnes which lies on the south west side of the broad swamp which
I suppose to contain near three hundred acres, also one negro woman named Betsy and her two chil-
dren Isaac and Abram, one walnut desk, one large iron pott two large pewter dishes and six
plates, one feather bed and furniture, one safe and one pine chest and to him and to his heirs and
assigns for ever.

I give devise and bequeath to my son West Moody the remainder of the aforesaid plantation being
all that part thereof which lies on the north east side of the broad swamp, and which I suppose
to contain fifty acres also three negroes viz Jacob a man, negro woman Adela, a negro boy Sambo
One feather bed and furniture, one walnut oval table, two large pewter dishes and six plates
one large iron pott & one potash and to his heirs and assigns for ever.

I give and bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth Moody my Negro woman Beck and her child
Violet, and my negro boy Abram, also one feather bed and furniture, one beaufatt, one bay mare
one woman saddle and bridle, two large pewter dishes and six plates, one walnut oval
Table, One chest the best in the house and to her heirs and assigns for ever.

Fairly All the remainder of my estate of every kind after my just debts are first paid I desire shall
be equally divided among all my children, viz. Samuel West and Elizabeth Moodys and their
heirs and assigns.

Lastly I do hereby nominate, ordain constitute and appoint my friends John Anderson, Josiah Dick,
Stephen Johnson and Jordan Denson my whole and sole executors to this my last will and
testament, and I do hereby ratify and confirm this writing to be my last will and testament
hereby revoking and disannulling all other wills by me heretofore made. In witness whereof
I have hereunto set my hand and seal this twenty fourth day of February anno Domini One
thousand seven hundred Eighty and three.

At a court held for the county of Southampton on the 10th day
of April 1783. This will was presented in court by John Anderson one of
the Executors therin named and proved by the oaths of William Barnes &
Jerry Williams two of the witnesses thereto & allowed to be record. And on the motion of John
Anderson the Executor therin named who made oath according to law a certificate is granted
him for obtaining a Robt in due form giving security Execution vs.

health & memory but calling to mind the mortality of my body, and knowing that it is or
dained for all men once to die do make and ordain this my last will and testament in
manner and forms following, first of all I command my soul into the hands of almighty
God that gave it me and my body to be decently buried at the discretion of my executors.
