In Obedience to an order of the worthful court of Southampton bearing date the 17th April 1783 we the subscribers being first sworn did appraise all the Estate of Lilleston Turner dead that was brought to our view & state the same as above.

At a court held for the county of Southampton on the 12th day of June 1783. This Inventory & appraisement of the Estate of Lilleston Turner dead. was this day returned & ordered to be recorded.

In the name of God. Amen. I Joshua Wood of the parish of Northney and county of Southampton being weak in body but of perfect mind & memory do make & ordain this my last will & testament in manner & forms following.

First I leave unto my wife Sarah Woods the use of the plantations whereon I now live with the lands adjoining containing One hundred & fifty acres also Fifty five acres adjoining purchased of Nathardson Riggins, also the land & plantation of Shardon's place containing One hundred & thirty eight acres, also four negroes namely Sarah, Rose, Richard & Dick, during her natural life or widowhood.

Secondly I give & bequeath unto my Son Benjamin Wood Ten thousand weight of Tobacco due my by bond from John Butts's Estate, with the interest due thereon, also I give my said Son, one negro Boy named Charles, one feather bed & furniture & Ten pounds current money of Virginia, to him & his heirs for ever.

Thirdly I give and bequeath unto my Son Joel Woods the land and plantation purchased of Nathaniel Davis lying in the Appamassoc Swamp in Southampton County containing Three hundred & thirty five acres more or less. I also give my said Son Joel one feather bed & furniture, one Horse of Five pounds Value, two Cows & Calves & two sows & pigs on the Value thereof to him and his heirs for ever.

Fourthly I give & bequeath unto my Son Edmund Wood after the death or intermarriage
